COURSE BACKGROUND

Objectives: As members of many types of organizations throughout our lives, we are all affected at some time or another by their internal dynamics. These dynamics consist of the behaviors of individuals and students as they work and interact together within the organization. To help us best understand and address these issues, the field of organizational behavior has developed as the study of the behavior of individuals and students in organizations.

Each one of us is part of not just one organization but of various organizations. A family is a kind of organization. Schools are a kind of organization. Even orchestras and kids' sports teams are organizations. But after graduation, in your worklife, you will likely be *employed* by and *immersed* in a far more complex organization. Certainly, organizations are made up of multiple people—actually, humans—and each human and person has their own psychology, attitudes, and behaviors. When people tackle an organizational goal, the organization must coordinate and can behave *dynamically* in predictable and unpredictable ways. Along this line, we will explore, describe, & investigate how organizations behave.

Required Materials: All material (including any readings, lecture material, and cases) will be available on http://chsieh.com. The password for the course page is "minor". [Important: Please make sure to join the BUS326 Katalk group.]

<u>Attendance.</u> I will collect attendance daily. The truth is that student grades in my BUS326 course remarkably correlate with attendance. (Please note that I will follow the SUNY Korea handbook when it comes to grades based on attendance.)

Homework. There are only two homeworks assigned during the semester. Each homework will be made up of "long-answer" questions, i.e. questions that require at least a 1/3 or 1/2 page to answer properly. These homeworks must be completed individually. Homework will be assigned via Qualtrics. On average, you can expect roughly 20-30 pages of reading, per week. Please save your homework as a .doc file in case Qualtrics runs into technical difficulties!... Late homeworks will generally **not** be accepted. If I ask you to re-do an assignment, the best score that you can receive will still likely be lower than the next higher score on that assignment in our class this semester. You cannot re-do an assignment unless I request it.

Organizational Behavior is not an exact science; there is room for subjectivity and opinion. Thus, *homeworks assess your critical thinking and your ability to integrate concepts*, and are

graded based on the clarity, completeness, and conciseness of your answers. Please come see me if you have a need for specialized feedback.

Quizzes. There will be four quizzes during the semester. Each quiz will consist of multiple choice questions (including fill-in-the-blank) and short-answer questions. The short-answer questions will require something like 4-6 sentences to answer. I anticipate that you will have 20 minutes to complete the quiz in class. [Please note that if we are physically in the classroom for quizzes, the quizzes will not include short-answer questions.]

<u>Midterm.</u> There will be no midterm in this course this semester. In fact, the quizzes substitute for the midterm. I structure the course this way because I believe that OB is a topic that is best learned by combining concepts over time.

<u>Final exam.</u> It will be ~2 hours long, and composed of multiple choice, and Short Story response questions. Details of the structure of the Final Exam will be described 1-2 weeks beforehand... Note that our review of "The Individual" in one of the last class sessions of the semester may be combined with the subsequent review session on "The Group and the Organization", so that we have a customized in-class activity instead.
